This is a consolidation of 10 **IIM Mumbai**, WAT PI Experiences. These are consolidated from various online sources.

Candidate Profile is also given in most cases, for you to understand the Personal Interview better. These WAT and PI are conducted across India at Bangalore / Delhi / Kolkata / Hyderabad / Mumbai.

After reading the entire Document you are required to check on your CATKing IIMWATPI Super 30 Dashboard :

1. Build Your Interview Skills (Videos from IIM and SP Jain Alumni)
2. Functional Dossiers: If you want to pursue an MBA in Marketing, choose that dossier first.
3. SOP / Application Forms (Check out Jagesh Golwala (IIMA), Raj Doshi (IIMA), Jay Gosalia (IIM B))

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Interview and WAT Experience–1

I had an interview on 30th March 2023 (2 Pm slot) and I reached NITIE on the same day. The accommodation was pre-arranged at MDP and I seriously admired the view of lake from the building. It's a really beautiful campus.

I reported at the admin building and the process started off with the document verification. Tedious process and literally took more than 1 hr. It was followed by a GD and our topic was "One India One election". I had to wait for 1 hr to enter the Gd room.

GD

3 Profs in GD, P1 Female, P2 male, P3 Female

Due to the triviality of the topic, the discussion soon turned into an argument and people started attacking others instead of arguments. It ended in 12–15 mins and was a bad experience overall. P1

Right after the GD, I was guided by Adcom to my panel (NO 7). After waiting for nearly 45 mins my Panel was shifted and I was told to go to panel no. 10. It was 5 o'clock by now and I was feeling a bit tired (wearing a suit and tie in humid weather causes a lot of discomforts). I was the second last candidate in my panel and hence had to wait.

Sitting outside the panel room

The room suddenly opened in the middle of an interview. A woman in her late 40s came out and inquired about something from the Adcom. An overzealous guy (lets name him Z) uttered something which seemed to me like a reply. Prof. looked at him slyly and asked her in a plain, smooth manner; Prof: "You seem eager to answer question"

Z; "Yes Ma'am"

Prof; "I will grill you" (Tone was more a sweet warning) Z: Smiled (A bit puzzled I guess.

In about 10–15 min I was called for the interview.

Interview panel: 3 profs, P1: F (Late 40s), P2 (M, early 50's), P3 (Early 40s) (Order - left to right)

They were sitting across a large table. P1 & P2 were busy with some documents and P3 was staring at his laptop (Bored probably)

I entered the room, greeted them all and sat on a small stool in the middle of the room. P1: Introduce yourself!

Me: Started off in a high enthusiastic pitch and went on for about a minute. P1: Where do you work, what is the sector?

Me: Tells them about the company I work for (I work in Oil & Gas Industry). P2: Cuts me in middle and asks "what is upstream and downstream?"

Me: Tell them about it it was followed by a few more question from my work and then suddenly... P1: What projects did you do in your college? (In a sharp tone)

Me: Told them, I have done a few on Automobiles, Alternate fuels and E rickshaw.

P1: (Suddenly makes an interesting face) Ohh did you? Tell me how an automobile starts? (Condescending tone)

(P2 Staring right at me as if scrutinizing the thoughts in my brain with a cunning smile)

Me: (I felt a plunge inside my body and my mind was filled with bliss, Automotive is my area of interest) I started off right from the ignition system and ended on final transmission and drive. (I felt quite pleased as in a previous interview I had fumbled on similar kind of thing)

(P1 & P2 seems happy. Both smile at me and look at me benevolently. P3 is sleepy)

P2 ask some more questions from materials used in cars which fortunately I was able to handle) P2: "Okay tell me what do you do other than academics?"

Me: Sir, I write answers on Quora (Brag about being most viewed in Diesel engine & Cars)

P1: So, you feel you are an expert in automobiles? Why don't you work for any automotive companies? Me; Explained them about it.

P2: So, you write answers on online forums. Suggest me a car?

Me: Inquires about requirements and usage (Forgot to ask about Budget) Suggest Ford EcoSport. P2: Oh no! It's way too costly, we are profs here not Managers (All of them laughs)
Me: Suggested a few hatchbacks.
(P2 was really inquiring about why I suggested these cars and their pros and cons) P1: Which car do you drive?
Me: Vitara Brezza
P2: What did you say you do?
Me: Smiling a little and explaining how my father also love cars so its like a dream to own a compact SUV.
Inquires about my family background
All of them look at each other and wished me luck. I started walking outside and almost opened the gate when P1 called me started asking questions about my workex. I was feeling strange and they didn't stop. 10 more minutes of questioning before I leave.
I walked out of the room and called my sister (she also had the interview on same day). I walked and reached the stairs when the adcom called me on top of his voice "They are calling you back". I was taken aback. Cut the phone call and rushed to the room. Opened the door and ask permission to enter. They smiled and asked, "What is your name?"

Interview and WAT Experience–3

It was a new challenge for 2020–22 batch

Course applied: PGDIM Interview date: 27th March 2020.

Mode of Interview: Online

Profile: CAT 98.33, 10th/12th/Grad: 9/8/8, Work Ex: 32 months at the time of interview.

The Interview pattern was entirely new this year. The offline interview got canceled due to the COVID-19 crisis. NITIE announced that it will be canceling the GD process and taking online interviews.

The online interview: We received a set of six questions on which we needed to prepare a talk for five to seven minutes. The questions were as follows (I'm presenting them in the same manner in which I've received them):

1. General profile (name, location, undergraduate/post-graduation, and any other degrees).
2. Project (s) related details
3. Job profile and major challenges faced

or

Candidates without experience (Freshers) may speak about

Role of machine learning/AI etc. in selected problems of your discipline.

4. Any specific achievements like publications, conference presentations, awards, hackathon type participation, etc?

5. Why you have chosen NITIE?

6. What is your career goal?

Apart from these six questions, there was a surprise question on current affairs. The time allotted for surprise question was two minutes.

Platform: The interview was a recording session on the TALVIEW app/website. After login with your credentials(given by NITIE), the app prompts the first question. After 30 seconds the recording starts with a timer of 7 minutes. Once you submit the first response, the second question comes on your screen and the answer is similarly recorded for 2 minutes. We were given a time slot for recording our interview.

My take on the Interview: I prepared a write-up beforehand and practiced it several times, to see how much time I'm taking. From my perspective the interview was designed to test the following skills:

Communication Skills.

Body Language(Since it was a video recording).

Confidence and fluency of a candidate(a monologue of seven minutes is quite difficult to manage).

Construction of your monologue. Structure, coherence, etc.

What data you present and how well you present it.

One's capability to manage the flow of information at a speed in which you're able to deliver the intended meaning within the stipulated time.

Candidate's profile.

Keeping these things in mind, I created a structure for my monologue. Before this interview, I wrote a couple of SOPs for different institutes. This helped me in framing my answer.

I started the monologue with my basic introduction. I picked up my education one by one. After their descriptions, I mentioned the achievements related to them. While addressing the work experience and project part, I made sure to highlight all my industry-related achievements. The 'why NITIE?' question was the make or break kind of question. I personalized my response while highlighting how the industrial-education expertise of NITIE can help me prosper in my career. Finished this entire section in just around six and a half minutes.

Surprise question: It was about the pros and cons of Direct Bank Transfer of money to the people below the poverty line, rather than food grains. It was recently in news and I was fully prepared with facts. Mentioned the case of Lieutenant Governor Kiran Bedi vs the state government of Puducherry. I provided arguments for both aspects and then stated my preference.

Tip: This type of interview is known as an asynchronous video interview and is common in the placement/summer internship process of many companies. They use it to shortlist people in the initial stages of interviews. Overall it was a new and nice experience for me.

Final Verdict: Converted.

Edit #1 They also asked this question — What is the significance of Factor of safety while designing a part?

This year, NITIE scrapped the GD and conducted online PI because of the lockdown. The application used was Talview.

It was not actually an interview as there were no panelists present. There was a set of questions that appeared on the screen that the candidate had to answer while the recording was going on. Around 7 minutes were allotted to answer these questions and the candidate had to answer them in one go.

The questions were as follows:

General profile (name, location, undergraduate/post graduation and any other degrees).

Project(s) related details.

Job profile and major challenges faced(for people with work experience).

Internship related details(for people without work experience).

Any specific achievements like publications, conference presentations, awards, hackathon type participation etc?

Why you have chosen NITIE?

What are your career goals?

All the candidates were already informed about these questions, so I had prepared well what to speak.

After this, it was time for the surprise question. The candidate had to speak for about 2 minutes on a topic.

The topic I got was "Is Make in India a success or failure?"

Verdict: Converted (2nd list)

NITIE really did a good job in completing their process. Infact, they were the first one to act and complete the process online. However, do not expect this kind of process in the future.

Did not get accommodation so stayed in an OYO nearby. The document verification process is a little tedious so be ready for a long duration process.

Group Discussion Topic: Make in India. Has it been successful?

Batch of 10. I killed it in the GD. Mentioned about various global indices. How it is a long term plan and why China is ahead of us. Overall only few people participated and I was able to stand out in the GD. Very happy and confident for the interview now.

Personal interview:

Two people. Both professors. One male, the other female. Let's call them M and F.

Me: "Good morning Sir. Good morning mam. May I"(Asking them to sit)

M: "Why you plan on standing?"

Me: "No sir." (Wow! What a start?)

M: "Then sit."

F: "Can you tell me what is stress?"

Me: Answered.

F: "What is Strain?"

Me: Answered.

F: "And which one of them are you right now? Stressed or strained?"

Me: "Neither of them. Mam"

M: "What have you learnt from Nirav Modi?"

Me: "You have to know when to leave a sinking ship."

First, they conducted the document verification process and which is really a tedious one at NITIE. You need to submit two sets of photocopies at NITIE during the Document verification. And mine became an extended one because I am a Diploma Holder after the 10th and the guy who was verifying everything did not know what is Diploma and hence, he took even more time verifying it with senior members. Finally, after a tedious half an hour, my documents were accepted.

GROUP DISCUSSION:

There were 2 faculty members. Both males and middle-aged. There were 8 of us in the group for GD. The Topic for discussion was -

Should Reservation be based on the Financial Status of an Individual rather than the Social Status?

I Completely nailed the GD. I started second in the Group Discussion and discussed the historical facts regarding why and how reservations came into the picture after independence. And thus continuing I put forward my points 4 times in the full GD along with providing a conclusion or summary of the discussion we had since I had jotted down all the main points. Thus, my group discussion was really good.

PERSONAL INTERVIEW -

I was nearly waiting for 1 and a half hours after my GD to get into the room for PI. In the meantime, I also went and had some snacks. Coming back to the PI, my name was called and I Finally went inside the room. There were 2 panelists, both male and middle-aged and sitting behind a table, busy with some documents. They saw me standing and asked me to take the chair. I sat there with a polite Thank-you. Now they asked me where were my documents I told them I have submitted the same in the morning. They called the Ad-com member and grilled him regarding the same as to why they don't keep track of the candidate's documents and form. I had become a bit skeptical after this as to

whether this had spoiled the mood of the interviewer's but the adcom member managed to calm them down and finally my interview started.

P1: So, tell us in brief about yourself..

Answer: I started with the well-rehearsed question starting with my academic background.

P1: [cuts in between] You said you have a diploma in computer engineering after your 10th. Why is it so and why not 12th and then a degree?

Answer: Again, answered him the same politely since I had already prepared for such a question. P2: So, tell me what did they thought you in your diploma?

Answer: I told them about the various subjects, the advantage of the diploma I had in degree, etc. P1: So, tell me what is the difference between a Diploma and a Degree?

Answer: I told them how a diploma helps to create a foundation for a degree and that degree has few subjects much more advanced than those thought in Diploma.

P2: So, tell us an example from a subject's perspective the difference between a Diploma and a Degree. Answer: I told them how in my diploma I only had DBMS as a subject while in my degree I have DBMS too but to a much-advanced level as well as an even higher subject such as the Distributed DBMS.

P1: So, tell me what is actually meant by a distributed DBMS? Answer: Answered the same in detail with examples.

P2: So, have you heard of the term Cloud Storage? [I answered in the affirmative] So explain to me what is cloud storage. [Jokingly] Does it mean storing data on the clouds that we see in the sky?

Answer: Smiling at his joke I explained to him how data is stored on some remote server and gave an example of Google Drive.

P1: So, tell me the advantages of cloud storage over traditional data storage methods.

Answer: Explained to him the advantages of reliability, availability, better protection, etc.

P1: So is there any company in India Providing Cloud storage or using their systems in the cloud? Answer: I answered him that if you consider the Aadhar Database it is itself hosted on the cloud as well as the Railway Booking system which is also hosted on the cloud or by the C-DAC supercomputer.

P2: So coming back to distributed Databases tell me does it mean that the data from a database has been distributed or is it copied or something like that? Explain to me in detail.

3. MSS: Maintenance Sub System

4. DCS: Data and Communication Subsystem 5: Rolling Stock

M1: What about Infrastructure?

Me: Sir I mentioned only that subsystem which is taken care of by Alstom.

M2: So Randhir, you have a great academic record, and its been less than two years since you graduated so you must be remembering your electrical engineering?

Me: Well, honestly I was not very well prepared with my engineering subjects, but I knew a NITIE interview is driven on your Engineering subjects so I said. Yes, sir, I remember a few of them.

M2: Can you tell me how can you make a transformer 100% efficient?

Me: Sir if all the losses like eddy current and hysteresis loss are zero with the leakage flux being zero and we are using CRGOS with lamination for its construction, it can be made 100% efficient. (Honestly, I was putting everything I remembered about transformer efficiency before them and hoped they picked whatever they wanted)

Amidst this chaos I was able to pitch in 3-4 times with some points regarding a regulatory body to be made with members from different countries and proper rules must be formulated to verify the data before anyone posts it. also talked about developing AI algorithms to control data etc.

Preparation: 3/5; Performance: 2.5/5

PI: Our panel had 2 profs one male and one female. let's call them M (in the early '40s) and F (in the early '30s).

I was 9th in my Panel.

M: So, Vinay please introduce yourself

V: Told the well-rehearsed answer (practised well after my blunders in my first interview :P)

M: So, what exactly is your profile at Tata Motors?

Both M & F: okay, All the best Vinay. V: Thank you, Madam, Thank you, Sir. Preparation: 4/5 ; Performance: 4/5

Interview and WAT Experience–19

Hello friend, here I am giving you NITIE Group Discussion and Personal Interview Experience of that person who has given this GD-PI round in 17th March 2011.....

In NITIE you don't have slots (morning & afternoon) for the GD-PI process. Everyone is called at 8AM. They provide accommodation to everyone in the campus at a nominal charge.

They were 10 people in my group, only 1 female.

GD topic : Women make better managers

No of panelists : 4

Time : 3 mins to think + 17 mins to discuss + 3 mins to conclude

A topic on which there was a lot to discuss. It was the sort of discussion where almost everyone did well. There was a fish market once or twice but

people immediately stopped, mature speakers as they were . Examples from both sides were discussed along with qualities that both bring to the table. In the end we concluded that its a case of merit rather than gender.

Luckily, had to wait for less than an hour for the PI (The unlucky ones had to wait for 4,5 hours). Here goes,

L1 : A middle-aged lady prof to my left

L2 : Another middle-aged lady prof to my left

P1 : An oldish prof right in front of me

P2 : A young prof to my right

P3 : Another youngish prof to my right

M : Me :P

M : May I come in ?
(Nobody replies, everyone inside is talking to each other. L1 waves her hand at me telling me to come in. I enter)

P1 : Have a seat.

M : Thank you.

P1 : Lovely combination of the shirt and tie.

P3 : What colour is this ?

M : Off white, creamish sir.

P1 : Impressed

(P1, P2, P3 share a laugh. Dont know if that was sarcasm !)

P2 : (almost giggling) Your face resembles XXX.

M : (smile) Yes sir I have been told many times.

P1 : Ok, xxx you have 25 months of experience in all. This is IT right ? Why are there so many IT engineers coming to us for MBAs ?

M : Yes, sir this is predominantly IT but in the banking and financial domain.

(cut short)

P1 : So, what do you want to do after an MBA.

M : told

P1 : So, do you know what all would be there in that ?

M : Yes, sir, it would involve Mergers & Acquisitions, Cost reductions, Org restructuring, increasing the efficiency of an org or a particular division etc.

(P1 points to P3 telling him to ask)

P3 : Talking about M & As as you mentioned, why do you think sometimes the stock price goes up when there is a merger and it also goes up when there is a division.

M : It reflects the market sentiment sir, how the investors feel about a deal like when Hero Honda split, their stocks increased because the investors felt that it was the correct decision.

P3 : Do you think it is important to consider the investors while making such a deal like after Tata Corus deal, the stock price of Tata dropped ?

M : Sir, the investors sentiment is important and must be considered but in the end the promoter of the org knows what plans he has for the org in the

next 5, 10, 20 yrs. He is in a better position to decide. But most of the people in the top and higher level management are given stock options so its in their own interest as well if they consider the market sentiment.

P3 : (said something)

M : Sir, in the end its about weighing the pros and cons of the deal and then going with whichever is heavier.

(P3 points to P2)

P2 : Going on the same lines, you know whats happening in Japan ?

M : Yes sir

P2 : Ok, you know their stock market has crashed. But yesterday the Yen became stronger against the dollar. Why ?

M : Sir, I think the US economy has some dependence on Japan, especially in two sectors - Automobile & electronics. So, since the supply chain and the

manufacturing plants are threatened this will affect the US economy as well.

(P3 nods but later on I found out that this was just a small part of the right answer.)

P2 : The govt of Japan has promised to inject XXX Yen into the economy.

M : Yes sir, for an any economy to function there must be money flowing around. Gave an eg from the subprime crisis. So, probably this too had an affect on the overall sentiment and made the Yen stronger.

P2 : What will happen to the home loan rates that many Indian institutions have taken from Japan ?

M : Sir, I think the floating rates will increase given the situation of the economy.

(Silence everywhere. All go through my form)

L1 : What is an embedded system ?

(About time...I said to myself. NITIE is known for tech interviews aur yeh kya ho raha hai yahan)

M : told

L1 : Tell me the features of an embedded system ?

M : told. Gave example and explained how it differs from an OS or other larger systems.

L2 : Why are your marks less in engineering ?

M : told (same thing about Pune university, tough etc etc)
