The **GRE (Graduate Record Examinations)** is a standardized test used for grad school admissions, assessing **critical thinking, writing, verbal & quantitative reasoning skills.**

Test Pattern

Analytical Writing (One section)	One "Analyze an Issue" task	30 minutes
Verbal Reasoning (Two sections)	Section 1: 12 questions Section 2: 15 questions	Section 1: 18 minutes Section 2: 23 minutes
Quantitative Reasoning (Two sections)	Section 1: 12 questions Section 2: 15 questions	Section 1: 21 minutes Section 2: 26 minutes

So, what is the eligibility criteria for GRE?

No academic eligibility criteria

No age limit criteria

Also **GRE scores are valid for five (5) years** and available for reporting for up to 10 years

Changes in the new pattern:

- Reduced from 3 hours 45 minutes to 1 hour 58 minutes.
- Argument Essay and the experimental section are eliminated.
- Less questions in both Verbal Reasoning and Quantitative Reasoning sections.
- Verbal Reasoning: Less focus on synonyms & antonyms, more emphasis on understanding complex texts and using vocabulary in context.
- Quantitative Reasoning: Increased focus on data interpretation and real-world problem-solving.
- The advanced adaptive design of the GRE General Test allows you to move forward and backward throughout an entire section

Analytical Writing Assessment (AWA)	Analytical Writing	Analyze an Issue: Evaluate an argument and present your own reasoning and evidence. Analyze an Argument: Identify strengths and weaknesses in a provided argument.
Verbal Reasoning	Vocabulary, Reading Comprehension, Critical Reasoning	Reading Comprehension: Analyze and understand complex passages, answer questions based on the passage content, identify main ideas, supporting evidence, and author's purpose. Sentence Equivalence: Find synonyms, Text Completion: Fill in missing words based on the context of the passage, considering grammar and meaning.
Quantitative Reasoning	Basic Math Skills (Algebra, Arithmetic, Geometry, Data Analysis)	Algebra: Solve equations and inequalities, understand algebraic concepts like exponents, functions, and polynomials. Arithmetic: Perform basic math operations with whole numbers, decimals, and fractions. Geometry: Analyze geometric shapes, solve problems involving area, perimeter, volume, and spatial reasoning. Data Analysis: Interpret data presented in tables, charts, and graphs, solve problems involving probability and statistics.
