Answer a) 2016 HO3. Scientists have identified a second, mini-moon orbiting earth that has probably only been around for about 100 years. The small asteroid has a slightly tilted orbit, bouncing up and down through Earth's orbital plane once a year. Over decades, as it scuttles along its path around the solar system, it twists back and forth. The asteroid has been declared a "quasi-satellite", too distant to qualify as an actual satellite but cinched by gravity into a relatively close orbit around the sun.
